**ADDITIONAL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ASSOCIATE OF ARTS DEGREE**

- No developmental courses may be applied to this degree.
- No more than 6 semester credits in independent study or internships may be applied to this degree.
- Minimum Grade Point Average 2.0; only grades of "C" or above may be applied to this degree.
- Students must complete at least 25% of their degree/certificate credit requirements at Front Range in order to earn their award from Front Range Community College.
- Submit graduation application, transfer credits, and credit for prior learning to the Registrar's office by published deadline.
- Continuing students who have not had a 12-month lapse in enrollment will be allowed to use the requirements listed in any catalog published while continuously attending the college.

Credit earned through prior learning methodologies (including CLEP, Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, articulation, military, corporate, challenge exam, portfolio credit, substitutions, correspondence courses, or independent study) may meet FRCC degree requirements. A student who is awarded credit using standardized credit for prior learning assessments may be granted a degree with designation and a gtPathways notation on their CCCS transcript. The receiving Colorado public institution will be obligated to honor the promise that completion of the A.A./A.S. with designation and/or gtPathways curriculum fulfills the lower division requirements as defined by the statewide articulation agreement. The receiving institution will evaluate those credits according to its standard policy. Students who wish to use credits awarded by exam to fulfill specific course requirements are responsible for consulting with the institution to which they are considering transferring to determine whether the credits they have been awarded by exam meet the standards of the receiving institution for specific course equivalents.
